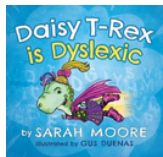


Top 10 Neurodiversity Titles: Are you in search of books that will captivate students who learn differently?

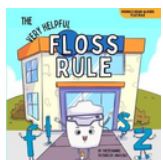

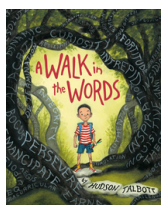
