



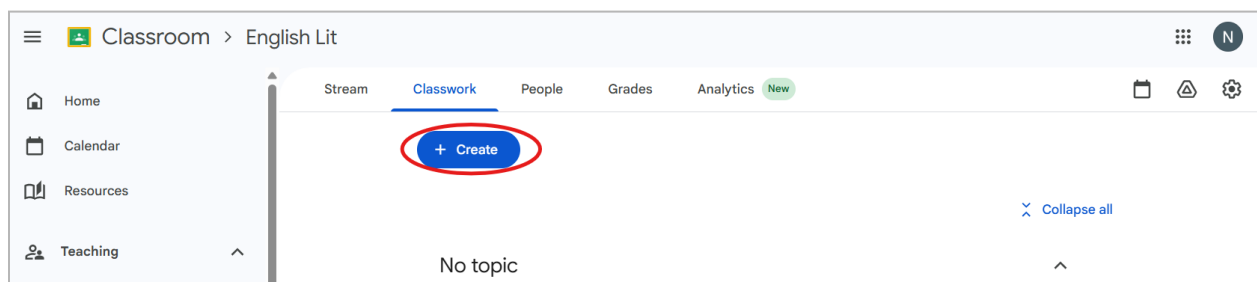
Learning Ally Audiobooks in Google Classroom

Learning Ally has been integrated with your school or district's Google Classroom environment! You now have the ability to provide audio books to your students directly in Google Classroom. Please read on for an overview of how to use this new tool.

How to get started:

Learning Ally will now be available when **assigning resources** to students from the Classwork section of your Google Classroom environment.

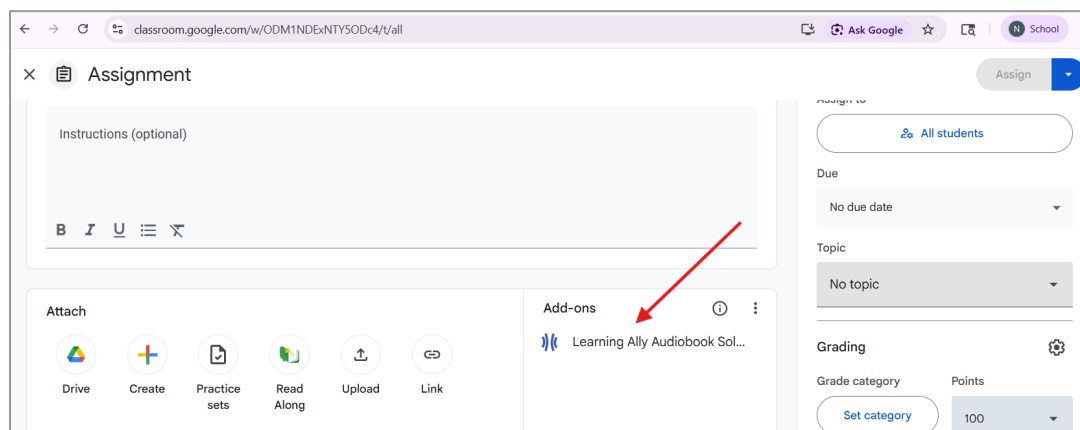
You can navigate to the tool by clicking on the class you want to add audiobooks to, selecting “classwork” and then clicking the blue “+ Create” button:



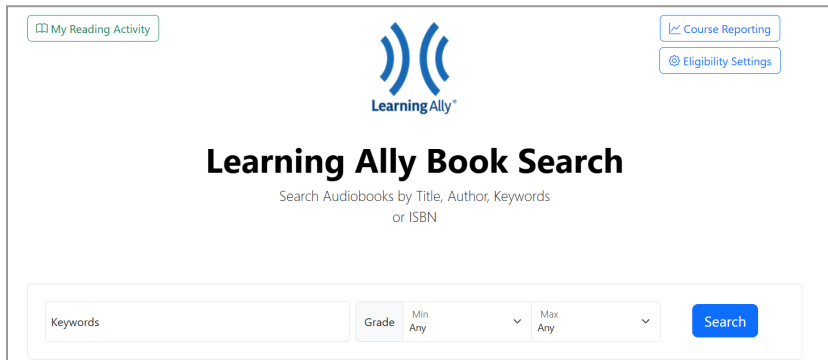
From here Learning Ally can be added to the following resources:

- Assignment
- Quiz Assignment
- Question
- Material

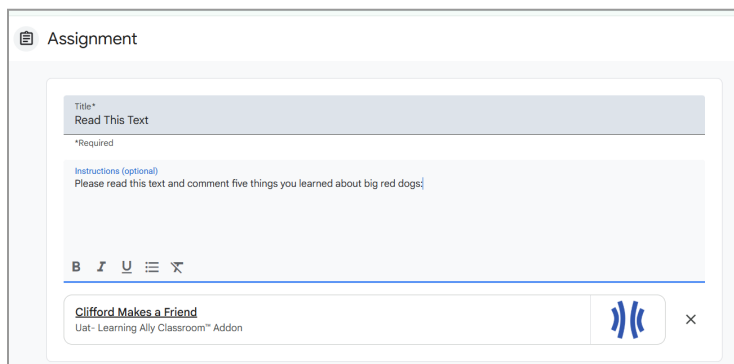
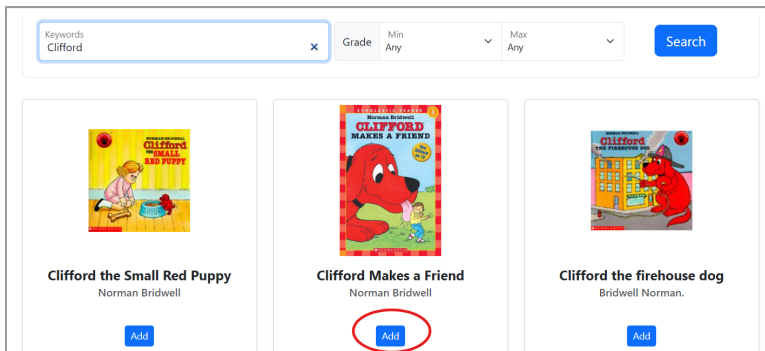
As an example, after clicking on “Assignment”, you will now see the Learning Ally icon underneath the “Add-ons” section.



If you click where it says “Learning Ally” our Learning Ally search page will populate:



From here you can search for any book we have in our library by: Title, Author, Keywords or ISBN # and click “add” to add it to the resource:



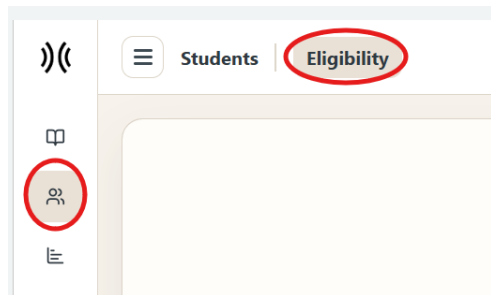
Once the resource has been assigned, the link to the book will be available for students to click on and begin reading.

Eligibility:

You may have noticed some additional tabs in the Learning Ally search page. The first one we will review is “**Eligibility**”.

Learning Ally is only available for students who have been identified as having a reading deficit. Please review our [eligibility guide](#) for more information on which students qualify to use the program.

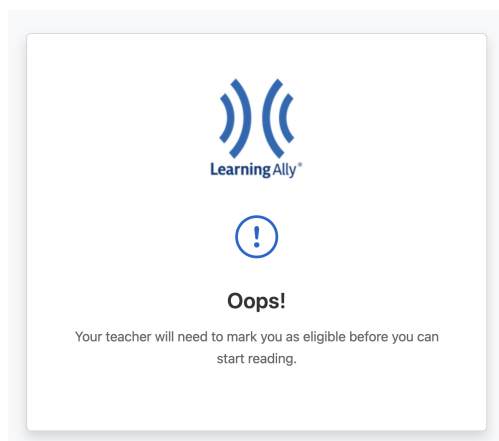
In order to access Learning Ally, students will need to be marked as eligible from the “eligibility settings” tab that can be found on the left side of the Learning Ally Search window.



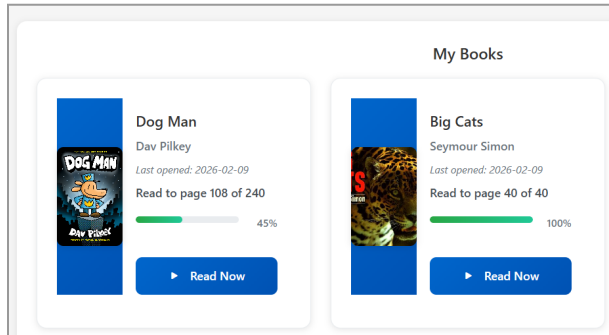
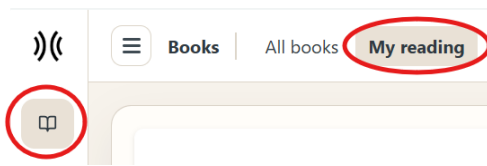
Once you click on this tab you will see a list of all students in the class you are in. You have the option to mark students as:

- Blind or Visually Impaired
- Reading Deficit
- Other Physical Disability

Once you have selected eligibility for a student this will enable them to access Learning Ally in any class or any resource that is assigned to them. If they have not been marked as eligible they will receive the following error message when trying to open a book until this has been updated:



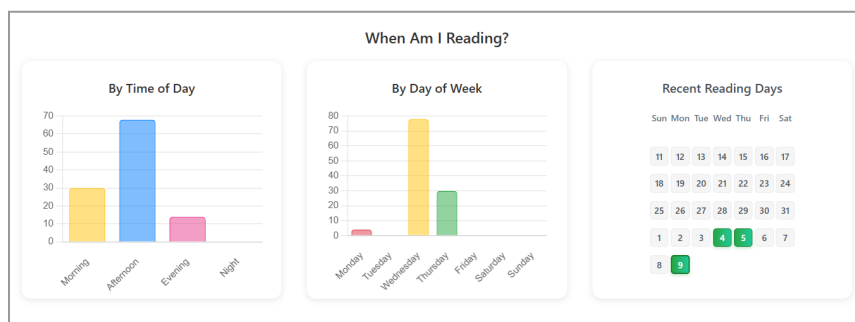
My Reading:



The “My Reading” tab will keep track of books you have previously opened, and is a convenient place to pick up from where you left off in a text. Just click “Read Now” to open up any titles you have been reading.

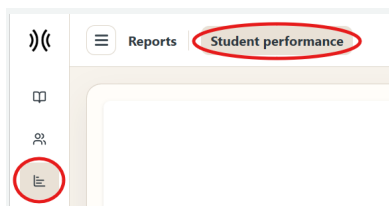


This tab also has helpful sections like “My Reading Activity” and “When Am I Reading?” that you can view to learn more about your reading habits.



Note: This functionality is currently only available for educator users.

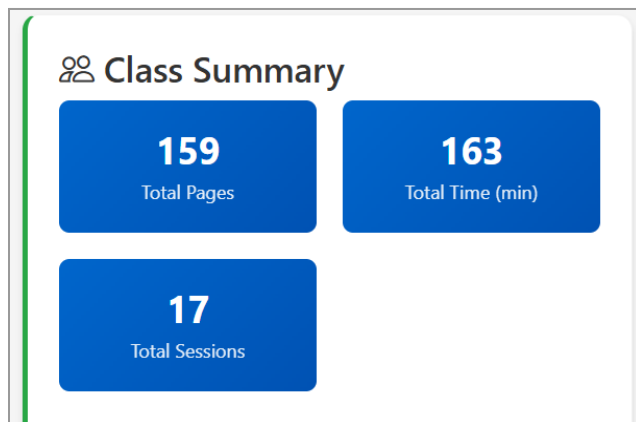
Student Performance



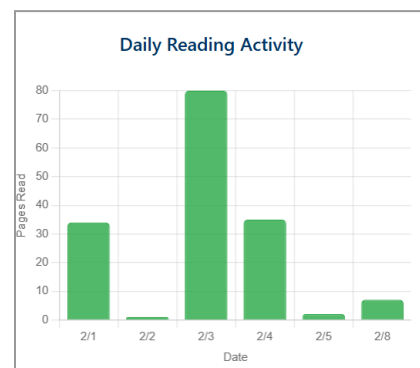
The “Student Performance” tab can be used to view student reading data in a course. After opening you will see a date range filter you can use to adjust the reading data that is displayed:



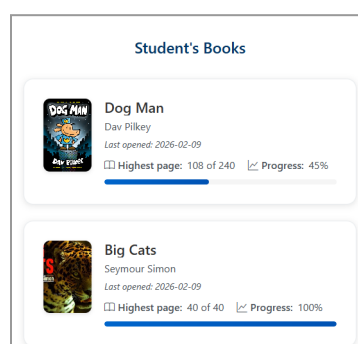
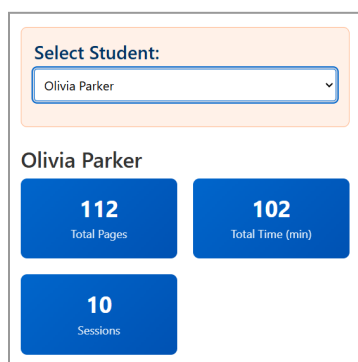
Below this on the left hand side you will see an overall summary of the reading being done by the students in your course:



Below this summary there are some graphs that will assist in communicating the reading habits of your students.



On the right hand side, you can filter by individual students if there is a specific user you want to check on. Below this you will see information about this individual student like if they have any reading streaks, and what books they have been reading.
